Your guide to abnormal avian droppings

What to look for:

Increased size or volume • Loss of firmness/consistency • Oily • Bulky • Colour change • Watery • Undigested feed • Smelly • Diarrhoea

Any of these changes can be caused by stress, certain feed, or can be a sign of disease. It is important to observe the droppings around the drinkers daily to be consistent. If changes are observed, call the veterinarian for expert advice.

- Small with a white cap (white urates)
- · Usually have a down feather attached to it
- Have no sign of wetness surrounding it
- Have no smell
- Dry

- Varies in colour
- Can be dark almost black/brown
